## General Info

- It is best to bubble in all answers if you don't finish; there's no penalty for guessing!
- Questions are all multiple choice.
- It is administered six times a year.
- It is better for math/science students, benefits students with slower reading skills, and caters to students who prefer shorter tests (3 hours).

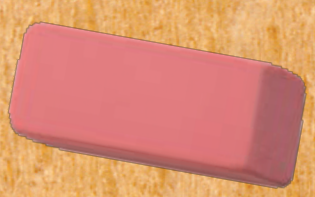
## Test Prep

- PLAN Test (ACT): This preparatory test will not help with scholarships, but will gauge what a person's actual score will be.

## Specifics

- **Four sections**
  - 45 minute English
  - 60 minute Math
  - 35 minute Reading
  - 35 minute Science
  - (optional essay)
- **English**
  - Easier vocabulary
  - Five short essays with 15 questions each
- **Reading** (four passages)
  - Prose Fiction
  - Social Science
  - Humanities
  - Natural Science
- **Math**
  - Calculator is a MUST!
  - It starts out easy and gets harder as the questions go on.
  - Algebra II is a big help.
- **Science**
  - Seven passages with graphs
  - Requires basic science knowledge and reasoning

✓ "Don't worry too much about the science section on the ACT. The long words are in there to confuse you - skip them and pay attention to the graphs."

## General Info

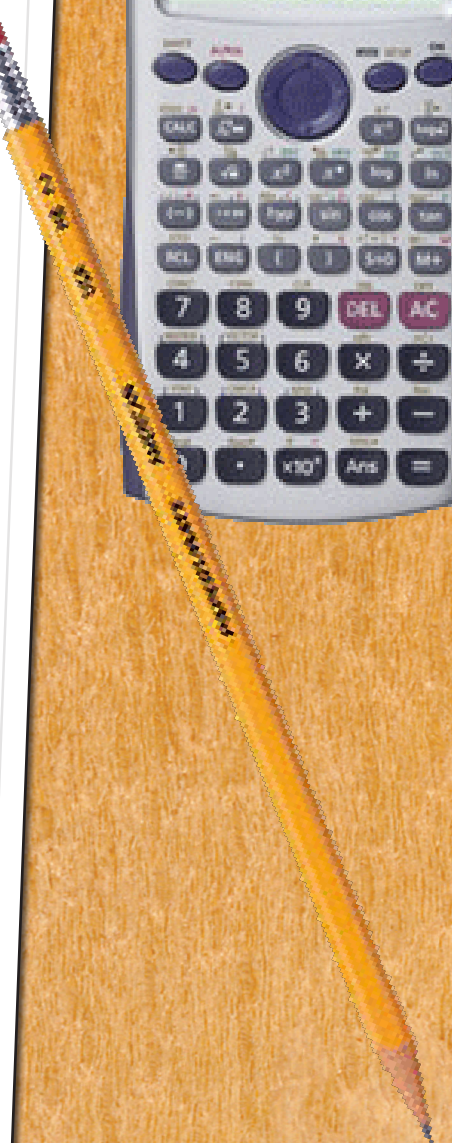
- Bubble guessing can hurt your score, so only bubble unknown answers if you can eliminate at least one answer. If you are unable to finish a section within the time allotted, leave the questions blank.
- It is mostly multiple choice, except one math section that is open-answer.
- It is administered seven times a year.
- It is better for students who excel in reading and English, are logical thinkers, and who can handle a long test (5 hours).

## Test Prep

- PSAT (SAT): This preparatory test allows prospective students to qualify for scholarships such as National Merit.

## Specifics

- **10 Sections**
  - 25 minute essay
  - Three 25 minute Math
  - Three 25 minute Reading
  - Two 20 minute Writing Skills
  - One 10 minute Writing Skills
- **English**
  - Sentence corrections and paragraph revision
- **Reading**
  - Much harder vocabulary with longer passages
- **Math**
  - Calculator not necessary
  - More logic/thinking skills; no trigonometry.
  - Generally better for students who struggle in math.
- **No Science**

- E. Eight

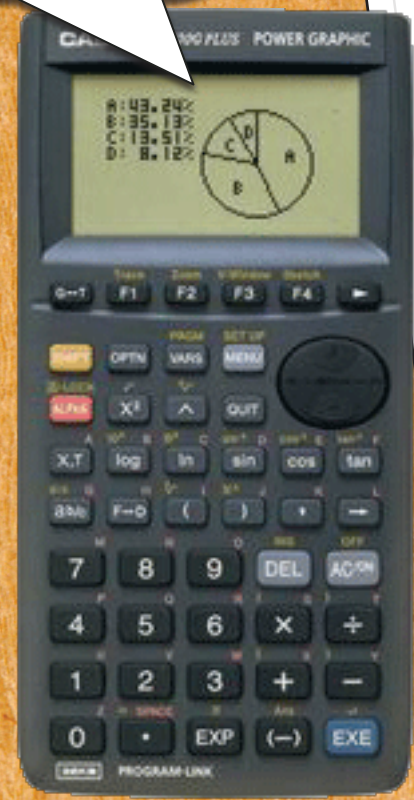
Answer: C

- C.  $9t - u$
- D.  $9u - t$
